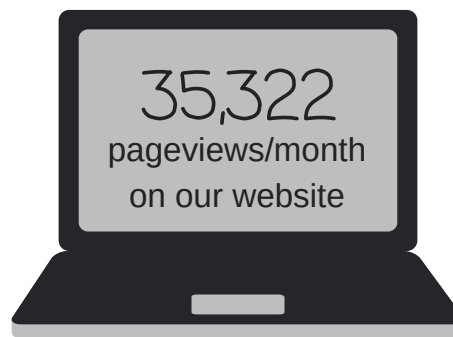
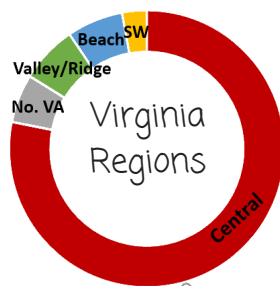
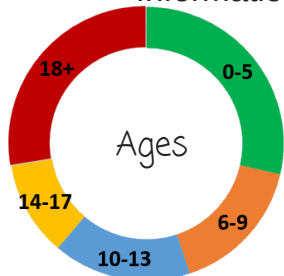
We hosted 99 clinic trainees and added our 17th clinic site replication in Virginia (Henrico Early Intervention)

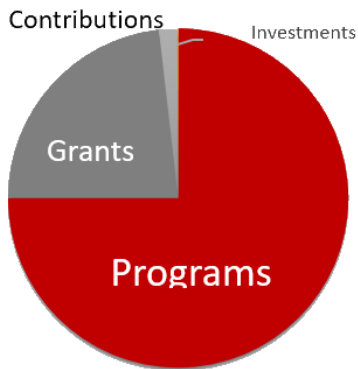

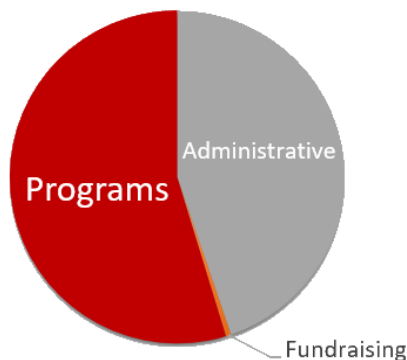

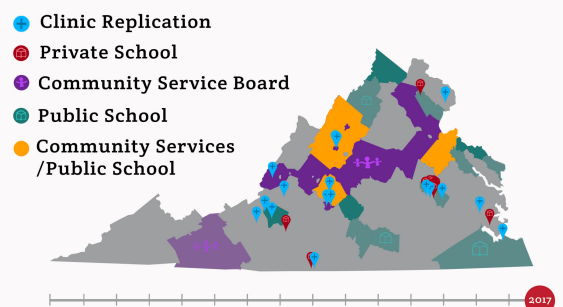
